Cookies make websites work better.

Cookies are small text files placed on your computer by websites or sometimes by emails. They provide useful information to companies, which help in a variety of ways. For you, it means you can use the site more efficiently and save time by not having to reenter your details each time you visit. They also make sure you receive the most relevant information from Delphi. For us, cookies help us to analyze how our customers interact with our sites so we can make improvements.

We use three types of cookies on our websites:

- · Session cookies that are deleted after each visit.
- Persistent cookies that remain in place across multiple visits to our sites.
- Third-party cookies that are used by our approved business partners.

Some of these cookies are essential and some are non-essential.

Essential Cookies

Certain cookies are necessary in order for you to use our websites. These are used 'in-session' each time you visit and then expire when you leave the site. They're not stored on your computer and they don't contain any personal data. However, you can delete them via your browser if you wish to, but this will restrict the functions that you're able to carry out on our sites. Tracker Cookies	These enable us to recognize repeat visitors to the site. Non-essential Cookies

These cookies are usually supplied by our business partners and help us to filter out irrelevant messages or pop-ups, and to make sure that we only send you information that's interesting and relevant to you. We also use some non-essential cookies for analytical purposes. Below is a list of non-essential cookies and how they're used:



From time to time Delphi PLC uses Google Analytics. This is a web analytics service provided by Google enabling us to recognize repeat visitors to the site. By matching an anonymous, randomly generated identifier, we're able to record specific browsing Analytics information such as how you arrive at the site, the pages you view, options you select, and the path you take through the site. By monitoring this information we're able to make improvements to our sites. Google also reserve the rights to the data collected.

The Google Analytics features we have implemented are based on Display Advertising (e.g., Remarketing, Google Display Network Impression Reporting, the DoubleClick Campaign Manager Integration, or Google Analytics Demographics and Interest Reporting).

Using the Google Ads Settings, users can opt-out of Google Analytics for Display Advertising and customize Google Display Network ads. We use Remarketing with Google Analytics to advertise online. Third-party vendors, including Google, may show your ads on sites across the Internet.

We and other third-party vendors, including Google, use first-party cookies (such as the Google Analytics cookie) and third-party cookies (such as the DoubleClick cookie) together to inform, optimize, and serve ads based on someone's past visits to your website.
